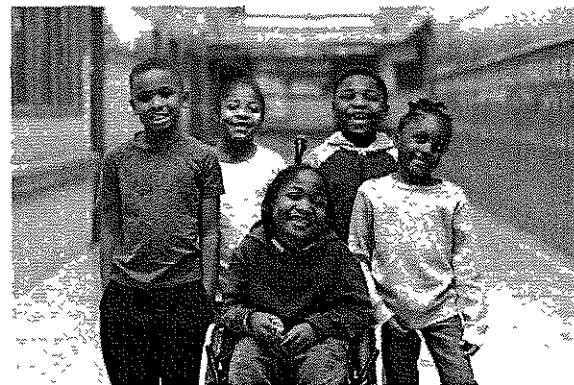

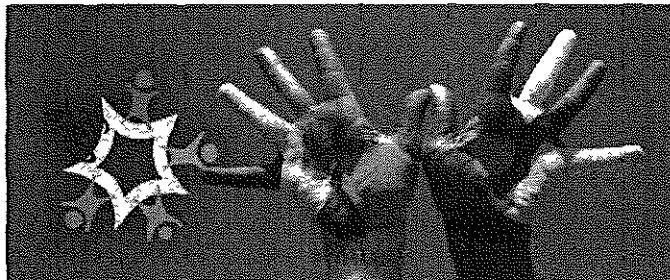

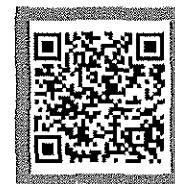

Milwaukee Fair Housing Marches Exhibit Comes to City Hall

Alderwoman Sharlen P. Moore is hosting the Wisconsin Historical Society's traveling display *Crossing the Line: The Milwaukee Fair Housing Marches of 1967-1968*. The exhibit will be on display in the City Hall Rotunda through February 14.

The exhibit commemorates the 50th anniversary of Milwaukee's civil rights marches through a traveling display examining the practices and prejudices that led to segregation in Milwaukee and chronicling the school desegregation and fair housing movements of the 1960s.

Alderwoman Moore explained, "As an African American woman and a member of the Milwaukee community, I want to remember and reflect on the racial inequalities that happened in our city. I'm proud to be a host for this display and to help raise awareness of issues our community has faced. It also connects to the importance of Black History Month and why we take this time to recognize and celebrate the achievements, contributions and struggles of African Americans throughout history. We are working toward a better education and understanding of history and experiences faced by those subjected to racial inequalities."

The eight panels of "*Crossing the Line*" tell the story of Milwaukee's civil rights marches in simple language, with 33 historic photographs and documents.

Other sponsors of the exhibit include, the Milwaukee County Historical Society, Wisconsin Black Historical Society and Museum, University of Wisconsin-Milwaukee and March on Milwaukee 50th Anniversary Coordinating Committee.

Dear Parent/Guardian:

Milwaukee Public Schools will begin spring testing in March 2025. These tests help us see how students are doing in reading, math, science, and social studies. Students are required to take these tests, but Wisconsin allows parents to request an opt-out for students in grades 4, 8, and 9-11. If you want to opt out, you must send a written request to the school principal. Students in other grades are expected to take the tests. We hope all students will take the tests. This helps us understand how well students are learning and how we can help them. All tests must be taken in person, this includes students in virtual programs.

Here is the schedule:

Grade Band	Test	Description	Testing Window(s)
Grades 3-8, 10	Wisconsin Forward Exam	Reading and math (grades 3-8), science and social studies (grades 4-8), and social studies (grade 10).	March 17 – April 25
Grades 3-11	Dynamic Learning Maps	A test for students with disabilities.	March 17 – April 25
Grades 9 and 10	PreACT® Secure™	A test aligned to the ACT® to check college and career skills.	April 8
Grade 11	ACT®	A test for college and career readiness.	March 12

Special Days for High School Students:

- March 12, 2025: Only 11th graders will come to school to take the ACT. At schools with students in grades K-12, 3-12, or 6-12, grades 9, 10, and 12 will not attend.
- April 8, 2025: 9th and 10th graders will take the PreACT. On this day, all students, including all high school students, will come to school.

Dear Parents and Guardians:

We have seen a rise in Influenza A, Covid, and pneumonia at Engleburg. We know that illness can strike any of us at any time, and the Engleburg School Nurse wants to share some simple steps you and your family can take to protect yourselves and everyone around you from serious illnesses, like colds and flu.

The Wisconsin Department of Health Services recommends that everyone age 6 months old and older get vaccinated against the flu. The vaccine is safe and effective and can prevent long absences from school and work.

In addition, there are steps the whole family can take to prevent and stop the spread of illness. These include:

- Wash your hands often with soap and water or use an alcohol-based hand sanitizer.
- Cover your cough or sneeze with your upper sleeve and try to avoid touching your face with your hand.
- If you use a tissue, throw it away after one use.
- Never share drinking cups, straws, and utensils.
- When possible, avoid exposure to people who are sick with flu-like symptoms.
- Eat nutritious meals, get plenty of rest, and do not smoke.
- Frequently clean commonly touched surfaces, like doorknobs, the refrigerator handles, your phone, and faucets.
- Stay home when you feel ill, have a persistent cough, fever, vomiting or diarrhea

If your child shows signs of illness, such as a high fever, cough, sneezing, or runny nose, please keep them home until 24 hours after the symptoms pass to prevent them from spreading illness to classmates and staff. You can find our policy on absences in the district handbook.

Working together, we can make this a healthy school year for everyone.

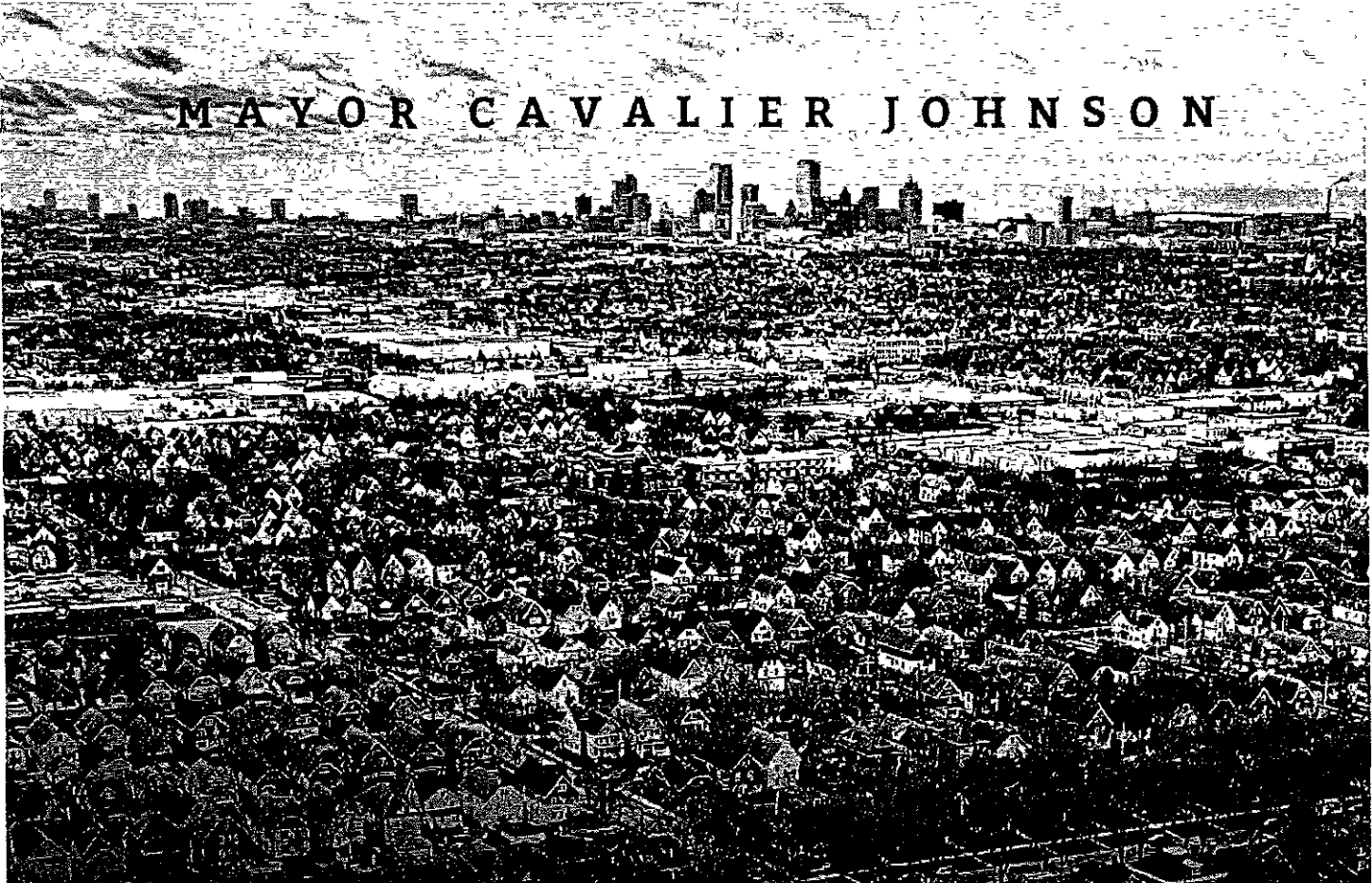
