With the 2025-2026 school year quickly approaching, we're getting ready for another exciting year of learning! To ensure a smooth start for all students, we're writing to you about a limited window for making changes to your child's schedule.

We believe that being prepared on day one is crucial for academic success. This means having a finalized schedule so students can immediately focus on learning without the disruption of changing classes. To support this, we have set a firm deadline for all schedule changes.

On August 13th, counselors will be available to support schedule changes for students in grades 6-12. Please review the bulleted list below for acceptable and unacceptable reasons for making changes to a student schedule:

Acceptable Schedule Changes	Unacceptable Schedule Changes
• A course was completed and passed during summer school • Schedule reflects a course that has already been completed and passed • Missing a necessary course for graduation • Schedule does not reflect a course that was selected during the spring selection process	• Student does not like the period the course is being offered (exception – dual enrollment classes) • Choosing different lunch hour to be with friends • Selecting a course to be with a friend or any other social reason
